

Dear parent/guardian,

This consent form relates to the Brisbane Catholic Education **Student Protection Art Design Competition**. BCE students from prep to year 12 have been given the opportunity to participate in an art design competition to create an artwork that will be used to promote student safety across all BCE schools. Winners will be announced during Child Protection Week 5th September to 10th September.

As part of the 2022 BCE Student Protection Art Design Competition, competition winners and their artwork may be photographed and promoted within BCE and in external media (e.g., Facebook, Instagram, BCE webpages, school web pages). BCE wish to use images of competition winners and their artwork, personal information including the student's full name, image/photograph and voice/video recording together with artwork information submitted into the competition, for external promotional purposes as detailed below.

Materials that are created and submitted by students, whether as an individual or part of a team, may be replicated in full or modified to be used in designs to promote student protection across BCE. This includes copyright material, including written or artistic works created in connection with the Art Competition. Personal information may include identifying each person who contributed to the creation.

Four winning art works will be chosen, and BCE may use elements of the artwork to create a final design which will be used on materials that will promote student protection in schools. This could include t-shirts for nominated staff members, lanyards, and posters.

Students with winning artwork will be invited to a special Child Protection Week event to be held at the BCE Office (2A Burke Street, Woolloongabba) on Thursday 8th of September 2022.

External promotional formats may include but are not limited to:

- media stories or articles
- photos taken at the Child Protection Week launch
- the BCE website and school social media pages
- new student protection promotional materials e.g. posters, lanyards, buttons, t-shirts for specific staff who are nominated as Student Protection Contacts.

Articles about the winning artwork and the students who created them may be featured in newsletters, the BCE public website, traditional media or social media. BCE may also use images on a range of materials including (but not limited to) advertising, marketing materials, presentations and publications.

Because of this, the Parent Consent Form provides consent for personal information and a licence for materials to be published online or in other public forums including -

- 1. student's personal information as detailed in the consent form,
- 2. use, replicate or modify the winning artwork for use in promotional materials for student protection including posters, lanyards, buttons and t-shirts.
- 3. use and modify the winning artwork for these materials to be published online or in other public forums.

BCE must receive consent in writing before it uses or discloses an student's personal information or materials in a public forum. The attached form is a record of the consent provided, including any limitations on consent.

Voluntary

It is your choice whether to give consent. Your personal information and your child's personal information and material will not be submitted into the competition without your consent.

Consent may be withdrawn

Consent to use personal information may be withdrawn at any time by you. If you wish to withdraw your consent, please notify BCE in writing (whether by email or letter). Please include appropriate contact information, (e.g., mailing address or email address), so BCE can confirm receipt of your withdrawal of consent.

Due to the nature of the internet and social media (which distributes and copies information), it may not be possible for all copies of information (including images and materials), to be deleted or restricted from use once published.

Consent for BCE to use your artwork: BCE intends to use part or all of the winning artworks for various student protection promotional material as outlined above. If consent to use the artwork is removed, whilst BCE will endeavour to cease to use the artwork on future projects. Content that is not in its direct control including current printed and published information and materials cannot be restricted, removed or deleted and BCE is under no obligation to communicate changes to consent with other entities/third parties.
